# AFFORDABLE HOUSING: CHARLOTTE-MECKLENBURG STRATEGIES FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

- Courtney and Ashley presented the recently released report, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Strategies for Affordable Housing Development (slide deck attached)
- Following the presentation, four groups were formed and worked through the following four questions.
  - 1) What new information did you learn today that you think is important for the work to close the gap around affordable housing?
  - 2) Which strategy or strategies most resonate with you? Why?
  - 3) What role can you play in implementing the strategy or strategies?
  - 4) What other information do you need to know in order to play an effective role?
- Each group reported back their responses to questions 3 and 4, which are summarized below:
